Embracing New Science Standards

The Catholic Diocese of Salt Lake City implemented the "Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS)" in all Utah Catholic Schools starting this school year. These new standards explore content at a deeper level, provide more hands-on science experiments, and include practices scientists use in the field. At Saint Vincent de Paul Parish School, we have always stressed the importance of supplementing science classes with the Hands-On Science Program and are embracing the new curriculum.

Saint Vincent School began its Hands-On Science Program for 5th through 7th grade science

classes in 1993 thanks to a parent volunteer, Nick Wiser. It has been run, ever since, by a group of dedicated volunteers from the parish, now under the coordination of Bill Benda. This school year, six volunteers are coming into the school 20 times to work with 5th through 7th grade students. With the NGSS standards, we are incorporating hands-on science education in grades K through 8th.

Last spring, we reached out, through our annual appeal drive, to raise funds for purchasing hands-on science materials and modules that support the new science curriculum. Alumnus R. Russell Meyer, along

with his wife Marcy, took the appeal to heart and donated \$10,000 to support the program. This is not the first time the Meyers have made a contribution to the science program at Saint Vincent School. The first year the school opened, Meyer was in the fifth grade and asked his teacher, Sister Lelia, why they didn't have a science fair at the school. Being from Ireland she did not know what that was. She said, "Russell was quite mature for his age, so I listened and told him we should try it." A month later the first science fair was held and has continued every year since then. The science lab is dedicated in his name.







Building Partnerships and Forming Relationships

aint Vincent middle school students are building partnerships and forming relationships with senior community members throughout the school year. The Senior Center Partnership Program at the school allows 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students to attend monthly activities with residents at their partnering senior centers: Paramount Health and Rehabilitation, Cottonwood Creek Senior Living, and Sunrise Senior Living. The goal of the program, now in its tenth year, is to teach students how to develop strong interpersonal relationships with others through long-term service opportunities; keeping in line with our schoolwide learning expectations in which "serve others" is the first expectation for all students.

To facilitate the long-term community engagement, students in the 6th grade are matched with a senior citizen and follow that senior every year until their 8th grade graduation. Vice Principal Sarah Lambert says, "This pairing allows students to build a lasting relationship over the course of their middle school years, creating

something more meaningful than the Sunrise Senior Living Executive occasional visit to a stranger. When you are doing service consistently within one community, you are building strong relationships, not just checking a box."

Activities have included playing board games with their senior friends, Christmas caroling with the residents, and talent shows at the centers. In 2015, the 7th graders participated in a "Go4Life" program with their partnered center that utilized a "buddy" system

to establish exercise habits with a partner. **Sunrise Senior** Living residents came by bus to Saint Vincent School, and each 7th grader walked the school track with their senior partner and spent the walk sharing stories and talking about mutual interests.

Director George Wright expressed his admiration for the students stating, "Those were the most impressive children. My residents enjoyed the experience so much and the children were so kind and loving in their interactions with the seniors."

The day was so successful that there are plans for Saint Vincent School and Sunrise Living to make it an annual event.



Exploring Movement through Dance

aint Vincent students were treated to exploring movement through dance last spring with Lynne Larson of Repertory Dance Theatre. These movement classes were from a program she leads for Utah public schools that is designed to help students discover how the body can be used as an instrument of self-expression.

The movement classes taught



the students how to build strength, flexibility, endurance, coordination, and awareness while developing an understanding of the elements of dance: time, space, shape, and energy. Language Arts curriculum was also incorporated into the class when students had to creatively show elements of movement for given verbs and adverbs. One of the classes taught students how to use the different elements of dance for the syllables in their names. Another class worked in teams to solve problems through cooperation and collaboration.

Students enjoyed the classes and had fun learning with dance movement. As one elementary student said, "I really liked the movement and balance, and it was fun to act out words like 'adventurous'."

Literacy Team

The Literacy Team at St. Vincent is dedicated to supporting and enhancing the literacy program at our school. Our team of teachers and paraprofessionals utilizes a three-tiered model to provide various levels of support and intervention for the students. Our team focuses on the key components of phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension of our readers. At the Tier 1 Level, the Literacy Team creates reading centers, while interacting with all students within the classroom setting. For Tier 2 Interventions, small groups meet with the Literacy Team outside of the classroom to work on strategic interventions tailored to their literacy needs. Finally, the team provides Tier 3 interventions for individual students that need specific, systematic reading instruction multiple times per week. The team also works alongside the classroom teachers to integrate research-based instructional reading strategies and methods. The goal of our Literacy Team is to produce successful, confident, on-level readers!

Math Lunch Program

The middle school Math program at Saint Vincent is now divided into three divisions. By doing this, classes are much smaller, allowing students to excel with peers in their group. In addition to classroom instruction. Saint Vincent Middle School now offers Math Lunch. This is offered twice weekly and provides scaffolding, remediation, and differentiation aimed at ensuring that all students master required content. Many students take advantage of Math Lunch as a place to work on assignments in an environment where peers and a teacher are available to answer questions and provide immediate feedback. Math Lunch also provides an opportunity for differentiation that helps to reach a wide range of learners and ability levels. Students can acquire additional strategies (manipulatives, models, technology, etc.) to support the learning that happens in the classroom. Additionally, students may use this time to engage in math enrichment.

Giving Back

tudents learn to give back to those in need and help better our world through monthly collections for a select charity, food and clothing drives, and community service. By serving others, Saint Vincent students become more compassionate and aware of global issues. In 2016, Saint Vincent students donated \$8,000 which benefited the following charities: Sister Angela's Assistance Program, Sister Lucy's School in India, Make-a-Wish Foundation, JCC Senior Music and Memory Program, Mansally Foundation, Best Friends Animal Sanctuary, and the St. Vincent Soup Kitchen. In addition, hats, socks, and jackets were collected for the Road Home, food was donated to the Saint Vincent Food Pantry and Utah Food Bank, and soccer items were given to the Mansally Foundation.



2015-2016 Awards and Recognitions

Devin (Tucker) Beals - Class of 'oo


4TH GRADE TEACHER



"I've always enjoyed teaching second grade because the kids receive their First Communion and first reconciliations; I've loved teaching them the sacraments," she said. "It has been a real gift for me because the kids are so open to learning, and they are so excited about receiving Jesus that they are very moral; they want to do the right thing and learn how to do it right.'

Rhea is the "consummate Catholic school teacher," said

Mark Longe, Utah Catholic Schools superintendent, who was in administration at Saint Vincent for 19 years. "Rhea is very kind and caring; she lived her faith in the school, she always inspired kids to do their very best, she always worked well with the staff, she was a team player, and she loved teaching and it showed in her classroom," Longe said. She will be greatly missed by our community, and we wish her well in her next endeavors.
